

Camp Wilderness

Fishing and Shooting Camp

August 2-5, 2009

Spend 4 days and 3 nights fishing, shooting, camping, canoeing and boating at Camp Wilderness in Minnesota's North Woods.

Under the supervision of the experienced Camp Wilderness staff, girls and boys ages 11 through 16 can enjoy fishing for Large Mouth Bass, Walleye, Northern Pike, pan fish and even Muskie.

Facilities:

Camp Wilderness has 2,400 pristine acres of lakes and trees. Wildlife abounds throughout the camp. Loons, ospreys, Bald Eagles, deer, otters, mink, bear, and raccoons all live on the camp property.

While at Fishing Camp, you will sleep in one of the Camp's tents and eat in the Dining Hall. Hot showers are centrally located and the Camp Trading Post offers snacks and souvenirs.

Staff:

The staff is experienced and well trained. Each summer nearly 3,000 youth enjoy a camping experience under their supervision. Qualified medical personnel are available in camp at all times.

Check-in and Check-out:

Please plan to be in camp between 1-2pm for check-in on Sunday. Check-out is at 10:30am on Wednesday.

Fees:

The cost of this exciting program is only \$165 per camper! If you are under age 16, you do not need a fishing license. If you are 16 you need to purchase a Minnesota fishing license prior to arriving in camp.

Program Items:

Bait, tackle and other fishing equipment are included in the camp fee. If you have your own fishing equipment, please bring it with you. You are responsible for your own personal items, sleeping bag, rain gear, etc...

Program Activities:

This camp program is packed with activities, campers will do the following:

- Learn to operate a boat and motor
- Fish from the camp's large fishing pier
- Canoe
- Swim
- Fish on area lakes with experienced guides
- Learn to shoot a bow and arrow
- Learn to shoot a shotgun at clay pigeons
- Enjoy campfires
- Fish independently on Bad Axe Lake using a motor boat

Note: Campers must pass the camp swim test in order to participate in boating, canoeing, swimming, and area lake fishing.

Location:

Camp Wilderness is located 17 miles north of Park Rapids, Minnesota.

Camp Phone Number:

The camp number is 218-732-4674. Campers will not be near a phone during their stay, a message will be taken and then the camper will be located. When leaving a message, please let the staff know that it is for a camper in the "Fishing Camp Program".

Camp Rules

All campers attending Camp Wilderness agree to conduct themselves in accordance with established camp rules. Campers unwilling to do so will not be allowed to stay in camp. By registering their child for this camp program, parents agree to pick up their son or daughter within three hours of being contacted by the camp staff.

The camp rules will be discussed on the first day of camp. The following is a partial list of these rules:

- Illegal drugs, alcohol, and cigarettes are not allowed.
- Hazing, name-calling or any kind of harassment of other campers will not be tolerated.
- Campers must respect and take direction from camp staff members
- Lights out is at 11:00 PM, this means that campers are in their tents and quiet. This allows all campers and staff to get a good night's sleep. **Campers that are unwilling to do this will not be allowed to stay in camp for even one night.**
- In order to participate in boating, swimming or canoeing, each camper must pass the camp's swim test. Failure to do so will limit their ability to participate in these programs. **The swim test is made up of swimming 75 yards on their front, 25 yards on their back, and demonstrate the ability to float on their back.**
- While using motorboats, campers must follow safe boating practices as taught at camp.

These rules are intended to make each camper's experience at camp a safe and enjoyable one. Parents and campers must read and agree to follow the above rules. To participate in camp, each camper must turn in this form with their signature and their parent or guardian's signature, agreeing to follow these rules.
